Beth Elaine Lamberts, 92, of Green Oaks, passed away peacefully at home on Saturday, June 5, 2021.

Elaine was born March 28, 1929 in Coniston, Ontario Canada. Dr. Lamberts received her PhD. in Foods & Nutrition from McGill University in Montreal, and later relocated to the U.S. to teach at Michigan State University.
