Caroline E. Maxey of Lake Forest Caroline E. Maxey, 89, a former resident of Barrington and Libertyville, passed away on Tuesday, Feb. 21, 2011, at the Lake Forest Place. She was born Oct. 27, 1922, in Evanston, Ill., where she was a 1941 graduate of the Roycemore School. She attended Mount Vernon Jr. College in Washington, D.C. and was a member of the First Presbyterian Church in Libertyville, where she was a member of the choir and Abigail Circle. Caroline was a former presenter of the General Pershing Sword at the Superintendents Awards Review at West Point, N.Y. Her grandfather, Gen. Charles Dawes, a former vice president of the United States, made this award possible for a West Point graduate in honor of his late friend. In 1988, Caroline and her husband, Bill Maxey, moved to Lake Forest. Since then, she had been active on the New Hope Scholarship Fund Committee and the Spiritual Life Committee at Lake Forest Place. Surviving are three daughters, Caroline (Thomas) Plachter of Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., Barbara (Jack) Moberg of Marietta, Ohio, and Marian (Jim Fine) McNair of Lake Bluff; five grandchildren, Katie (Todd), Eric, Natalie, Daniel and Cody; and three great-grandchildren, Matt, Claire and Drew. She was preceded in death by her parents, Melvin and Carolyn (nee Dawes) Ericson; her brother, Charles Dawes Ericson; and her husbands, Albert S. Long Jr., Eric P. McNair and William W. Maxey.
