February 17, 1928 - March 6, 2015

Dale L. Yingst, 87, passed away on Friday, March 6, 2015 in Miami, Florida. He was born Feb. 17, 1928 in East St. Louis, IL and had been a Libertyville resident for almost 50 years. Dale received his degree in math and teaching at Culver Stockton College in Canton, MO and his degree in Industrial Arts from Western IL University. He later received master's degrees from Northwestern University and Arizona State University in Mathematics and Industrial Arts, respectively. Dale was a math teacher at Libertyville High School for over 30 years and during that time was also the tennis coach. He was a US Navy veteran and a member of the Grace Lutheran Church in Libertyville. Dale had a passion for flying and studied to become a pilot when he was in his 60's and flew recreationally for a number of years. Surviving are his wife Joan (nee Gustafson) Yingst; 2 children, Jeanne Buhrman (Dick O'Shanna) of Libertyville and Kreg (Sherri) Yingst of Pensacola, FL; 5 grandchildren, Meghan, Morghan, Madey, Sierra and Kiana; sisters, Janet (Larry) Baldwin and Shirley Malone. He was preceded in death by his sisters, Patsy Kalicki and Carol McCoskey and by his brother Jim Yingst.
