Douglas C. Mohler, 84, passed away on Sunday, July 1, 2012, at Advocate Condell Medical Center in Libertyville. He was born Oct. 5, 1927, in Liberal, Mo., and following his graduation from Liberal High School in 1945, Doug served with the U.S. Army Air Corps in Japan. He graduated from the University of Missouri in dairy science and came to work at Kraft in Glenview, Ill. He married Phyllis Collins on Sept. 29, 1951, at the First Methodist Church in Evanston, and would later work for TOPCO Associates in Skokie for 30 years. Doug was a very active member of the United Methodist Church in Libertyville and gave his time to many organizations. He was past president of the Lake County Chaplaincy program, the Gardeners of Lake County, and was an Eagle Scout and a Boy Scout leader for many years. He hosted foreign exchange students since 1959, enjoyed gardening and especially his family and extended family.
