June 8, 1926 - March 20, 2015

Elizabeth D. "Liz" Green, 88, passed away on Friday, March 20, 2015 at the Winchester House in Libertyville. She was born June 8, 1926 in Hampton, VA and had lived in Libertyville for the past 50 years. Liz entered the work force after high school at General Motors, where she would meet her future husband, Albert Baker "Bud" Green. They married on Feb. 3, 1952 and were married for 43 years when Bud passed away. Liz worked at Morton Manufacturing in Libertyville for 35 years as the executive secretary to John Morton, president of the company. During those years, she played and taught bridge, earning the title of Life Master. She was involved with the Girl Scouts, Cub Scouts and coordinated the design of the columbarium at St. Lawrence Episcopal Church. She was honored as a Libertyville Volunteer of the Year in 2000 for her countless hours involving her church, the Keep Libertyville Beautiful Commission and her devotion to helping others less fortunate. Surviving are 2 children, Martha (George) Madole of Libertyville and Albert "Baker" Green, III (Debra) of Kansas City, MO; 5 Grandchildren, Bill Madole, Maggie (Paul) Fletcher, Jason (Katie) Green, Michelle Green (T.J. Finch) and Tiffani (Nick) Hines. 5 and one-half grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her husband Albert Baker "Bud" Green, Jr. in 1996 and by 4 brothers and sisters.
