



Elizabeth S. Sledd

October 17, 1956 - July 17, 2023

At the end of her struggle with dementia, Elizabeth S. Sledd passed away on Monday, July 17, 2023. She was born on October 17, 1956 and raised in Northbrook, Illinois, graduating from Glenbrook North High School in 1974. In her senior year, she won first place, the Craftsman's Award, in the school's Festival of the Arts. Liz earned an Associate degree in 1977 from Triton College and had received her Bachelor of Arts degree in Physical Therapy from University of Illinois, Champaign-Urbana, where she was elected to the Phi Beta Kappa Honors Society.

In the summer of 1979, Liz was hired by Jean and Al Berthold at their store, Hi-Land Art & Frame, which was the start of a thirty-five year career in art, art supplies, stained glass and custom picture framing. Liz then purchased Hi-Land Art & Frame with her husband, Gregory, in 1989 from Jean and Al, and remained the store's owners until closing for good and retiring in 2014.

Sadly, in 2016 Liz was diagnosed with progressive primary aphasia, and for the past four and a half years she had lived in the Memory Care Unit at the Sheridan of Green Oaks, Lake Bluff, Illinois, where she passed away.

Liz was preceded in death by her parents, Grayce and William Seibert. In addition to her husband of thirty-five years, Greg, she is survived by her beloved daughters, Maggie (Max) Willer and Annie Sledd (Sam Routh); her loving sister, Connie (Fritz) Dale; cherished cousins, Susie Chemler and Wil (Karen) Seibert; dear in-laws, Sue and David Sledd and Mary Sue and Bob Crandall; adored nieces and nephews, Mandy Dotlich, Matthew (Christel)
