The resilient, generous spirit of Franklin Guy Zilkey, 83, was reunited with his loved ones in heaven on January 8, 2019. His loved ones included wife of forty-five years, Herta Loeper Zilkey; mother, Frances Zilkey; and father; Willard Zilkey.

He lived for serving his family, friends, and community through volunteer opportunities such as The Lion's Club and The Electric City Fire Department. He enjoyed model and full-scale trains, hiking, boating, gardening, football, baseball, animals, and music.

He is survived by his daughter, Leslie Kalvass and son-in-law Cory Kalvass; sister, Laura Rutkowski and brother-in-law Dan Rutkowski; and by his two

grandchildren, Carter and Corinne Kalvass.
