



Gaynor Hertlein SRN,RSCN

June 22, 1951 - June 17, 2022

Gaynor (nee Townroe) Hertlein, SRN, RSCN, who died on June 17, 2022, after a long illness, was, in no particular order, a much-loved wife, mother, grandmother, and nurse.

She was born in Nottingham, UK, in 1951. She graduated from Manning High School at 16, and became a nursing cadet, enrolled at Nottingham Children's Hospital, where she went on to earn her nursing degree, and became a State Registered Nurse (SRN), and then a Registered Sick Children's nurse (RSCN). Her nursing skill and compassion for the children were recognized, and she was soon promoted to Ward Sister for John Dane Player Ward at the Children's Hospital, becoming the youngest nurse to achieve that rank in the hospital's history. She assisted in organizing the move of the Children's Hospital to the brand new Queen's Medical Center (QMC) in 1977-78, and even got to shake the hand of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II during the grand opening of QMC.

In 1972 she met and married Bernhardt (Bernie) Hertlein, and eventually gave birth to two daughters, Sarah and Kimberley. However, marriage and starting a family did not lessen her love for her work, and Bernie often had to take her to the hospital after work or on her days off so that she could check on a particular child that she was concerned about. She would sometimes take a bed-bound long stay patient out in a wheelchair on her days off, just to give

them fresh air and a change of scenery. After Kimberley's birth and the death of her own mother in 1984, Gaynor retired from nursing to become a fulltime mother, and the family moved from Nottingham to Thelwall, in Cheshire, UK. Her love for pediatric care drew her back into infant care, and she became an assistant at the Thelwall pre-school children's playgroup (kindergarten).

In 1989, Bernie's job brought the family to United States, where they lived in Asheville, NC until 1992, then moved to Gurnee, IL, where Gaynor once again become a fulltime mother, and enjoyed expanding her cooking repertoire. She took particular joy in becoming a grandmother with the birth of Alexandria in 2008, and again with Kylie in 2018. Gaynor reveled in the role of grandmother, and provided Mama daycare for her granddaughters until her illness limited her mobility.

Gaynor was preceded in death by her mother and father, Gladys and Tim, her sister Diane, and brother-in-law Alan. She is survived by her husband Bernie, her daughters Sarah and Kimberley, son-in-law Scott, granddaughters Alexandria and Kylie, and nephew Simon.

Gaynor never wanted any fuss or ceremony, so there will be no formal service. However, she never lost her love of pediatric care, and always supported the mission of St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital.
