Throughout their 17 year relationship they learned all about life together as supportive partners and best friends. The constant love, trust, and respect they showed towards each other was beautiful. Jeremy and Jessie shared a love of travel and reveled in the adventure of experiencing new cultures and cuisines. Jeremy then brought these experiences home with his love of cooking and vast knowledge and appreciation of wine. Above all else, Jeremy lived life to its fullest. Jeremy had an amazing sense of humor which was his special way of connecting with family and friends. It was his art of humor and ability to face things head on that helped him navigate his battle with cancer and remain present and himself until the end. He was an

amazing husband, son, brother, uncle, and friend who will be deeply missed.
