John C. Hyatt, 76, passed away on Monday, August 11, 2025 at his home in Mundelein, IL. He was born August 19, 1948 in Muskegon, MI and was a longtime Libertyville, IL resident, living in Mundelein for the past 30 years. John was a United States Army veteran serving in Germany during the Vietnam War and received his bachelor's degree from Ferris State University in Big Rapids, MI. He spent the majority of his career at Cybertek in Vernon Hills, IL as a computer programmer. John started at Cybertek in the 1980's and was involved in creating the code, much of which is still in use today. He was a mentor to many of those that worked there. A team favorite activity was the creation of annual "road rallies", where the end prize was figuring out where everyone was meeting up after following a set of clues. These rallies were the source of both fun and frustration; John always enjoyed being the bearer of both!

At his home in Libertyville, his backyard vegetable garden was the envy of many, including the local deer. John was an avid coin collector, bowler and enjoyed playing poker, taking pride in competing in Las Vegas for the World Series of Poker competitions and even making it to the cash out rounds a couple of times.
