Joseph T. Melarkey, 86, passed away on Sunday, September 6, 2020 at the VA Hospital in North Chicago, IL. He was born March 6, 1934 in Chicago, IL, was a former 28-year resident of Lake Forest, retiring to Columbia, South Carolina for 6 years, and living in Great Lakes for the past year.

He attended Loyola University and the La Salle Extension University of the Stenotype School of Chicago. He was a former licensed court reporter and the owner of Melarkey Reporting Service in Chicago. Joe was a member of the National Court Reporters Association. At 12 he purchased a set of dishes for our mother with the money he earned from his paper route. He was always the one who kept the family together. His family and his Catholic faith were very important to him. He had a wonderful sense of humor and was in the habit of giving nicknames to all of his siblings: Harvey was Sargent Melarkey (since he was so neat), Pat was Bones (since she was so thin), I was Pocahontas (because of a book I read) and Mike was Little Ace (the baby of the group)! Growing up he was at all special occasions taking pictures and looking proud. When he left for the Army we were very sad, but he never forgot us. He would write great letters in his exceptional handwriting and you would feel like you were experiencing everything with him. He took us to Riverview, drove us to concerts and school events, took us out to dinner which was not the norm in our house and treated pizza on Friday nights. When I was ten I spent a month in St. Anne's Hospital in traction due to a broken arm, and he visited me every day.
