



## Joseph N. Sicuro

August 2, 1923 - May 17, 2016

Joseph N. Sicuro, 92, of Green Oaks, passed away on Tuesday, May 17, 2016 at the Highland Park Hospital. He was born August 2, 1923 in Chicago and had been a Libertyville resident for over 50 years. He was a member of St. Joseph Parish, a former US Army Air Corps pilot and was a Green Oaks Village Trustee and member of the Planning Commission and Economic Development Committee, retiring in 2010.

Joseph was a former co-owner of Laco Signs in Libertyville and was instrumental in manufacturing the first golden arch sign for the first McDonalds restaurant in Des Plaines. He was also a marketing and advertising executive for the Union 76 corporation, designed the Union 76 sphere and was honored as the 1969 sign program of the year award recipient. Family holidays and traditions were very important to Joe and he always loved being with family whenever he could.

Surviving are his wife of 44 years, Ann Sicuro; 2 daughters, Nicole (Christopher) Leipski and Gina (Brian) Hermreck; 2 grandchildren, Gianna and Sophia Leipski; his brother Philip Sicuro and sisters, Sophia Miglio, Virginia (George) Odom and his grand dog Tootie.
