



Rev. Kam Yau "Alan" Chan

November 9, 1955 - March 16, 2026

Rev. Alan Kam Yau Chan, 70, was called home by our Heavenly Father on Monday, March 16, 2026. He was born on November 9, 1955, in Hong Kong, and came to the United States in 1977. Alan completed his undergraduate studies at University of Hawaii, and later earned his Master of Divinity, Master of Theology, and Ph.D. from Trinity Evangelical Divinity School.

Alan devoted his life to ministry, teaching, and writing. He served as head pastor at Trinity Grace Church in Highland Park, Illinois, formerly Chinese Christian Union Church-North, for 24 years. After retiring, he continued serving as a seminary professor, guest speaker, and author of several Old Testament commentaries. He was known for his deep faith, compassionate spirit, and dedication to guiding and supporting his community. Alan will be remembered for his unwavering commitment to his faith, his kindness, and the lasting impact he made on the lives of those he served.

Surviving is his wife, Lynn Chan; 4 children, Amos Chan, Andrew Chan, Lauryn (Luke) Wildman & Aaron Chan; grandson, Jack Wildman; 2 sisters, Chui Har (Pak Wah) Lee & Kam Ling (Si Kei Hung) Chan and 2 brothers, Kam On Chan & Kam Fai "Roy" (HauWan "Sharon" Cheung) Chan; and many nieces, nephews, grandnieces, and grandnephews.

He was preceded in death by his brother, Kam Tong "Tony" Chan, and his parents, Wor Chan and Mui Lo.

A private funeral service will be held on Saturday, March 21, 2026 at Burnett-Dane Funeral Home in Libertyville, Illinois. A celebration of life will be held

CHAN Kam-yau was our school's "top student" back in the day — everyone knew he studied hard, was disciplined, and even kept his pencils perfectly lined up. Later he flew off to the U.S. to finish his bachelor's degree, then went on to get theology master's and doctorate degrees. He taught and served as a pastor there — achievements piled high, really impressive. I've got to be honest: I

couldn't keep up with most of his strengths — I'm the type who sees a school notice and thinks "holiday," sees a book and thinks "play." Put simply, we're on opposite ends of the spectrum: he walks the tightrope, I bounce on the trampoline.

We weren't close friends, really, so we didn't keep in touch much. He'd come back to Hong Kong sometimes and we'd grab a quick meal to catch up, update each other on our life apps. My biggest regret is this: we never really "had fun together." We never did any crazy stuff that would still make our parents shake their heads; we never built those youth-memories together. Now all that's left are a few photos.

On a serious note, Kam-yau's perseverance and faith are truly admirable. From a diligent student to deciding to enter seminary, then onto teaching and pastoral work — he took every step with care and has influenced many people. You could call him a life-navigation app: not flashy, but steady and reliable. Lately when I catch his sermons online, I feel calmed — grounded, passionate, with a gentle, kind look in his eyes (that last bit is my imagination).

Today, as we remember him, I don't want it to be too heavy — I just want to say from the heart: his commitment to faith was as systematic as his note-taking — solid, fail-safe, and makes you want to copy (legally, of course). Thank you, Kam-yau, for being such a good example. You left peacefully and steadfastly, and it makes me reflect: even though we walked different paths, your persistence and sincerity are things I really want to learn from. Rest in peace 🙏
