Kenneth L. Schar, 94, passed away on Thursday, Sept. 8, 2016 in Buffalo Grove. He was born July 24, 1922 in Libertyville, where he remained for the rest of his life. He was a 1940 graduate of LTHS and a retired Product Engineer for The Frank G. Hough Company in Libertyville. Ken was a member and served on the Vestry of St. Lawrence Episcopal Church, was a US Navy veteran, Eagle Scout, volunteer for the Libertyville Fire Department and a past Master of the Libertyville Masonic Lodge. He was honored to be in the Libertyville Senior Hall of Fame and enjoyed maintaining habitats for the North American Bluebird Society.

Surviving are his wife Beverly Schar; 3 daughters, Theresa Zumwalt, Patricia (Robert) Bartholomew and Susan Schar Duffin; 4 Grandchildren, Todd and Tenley Zumwalt, Conor (Danielle) and Kirstin Duffin.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Samuel and Christine Schar and by his brother, Bernie (Margaret) and infant brother Howard Schar.
