Laurian Allen Miguel, a resident of Lincolnshire, IL and a former resident of Bethel, CT and Springfield, IL, died surrounded by her family of a traumatic brain injury at Advocate Condell Medical Center, on April 17, 2020. She was born on December 29, 1940 in Cleveland, Ohio to Dorothy Stoker Allen and Ralph Eldon Allen, Sr. Laurian married Dr. Richard J. Miguel on August 15, 1964 and celebrated their 55th anniversary last year. She was preceded in death by her parents and her brother Ralph E. Laurian was graduated from North High School in Columbus, Ohio and The Ohio State University and is a lifetime member of The Ohio State Alumni Association. She was an elementary school teacher in Westport, Connecticut and a Program Associate at The Ohio State University and the University of Illinois. She was also a world-wide traveler having gone to the Caribbean, Panama, Costa Rica, Columbia, Italy, France, Germany, England, Ireland, Norway, Israel, China, Egypt, and many other countries.
