Marguerite L. Massin, 98, passed away on Tuesday, Oct. 4, 2022 in Deerfield, IL. She was born Jan. 25, 1924 in Fulton, IL, and was a true farm girl, raising pigs, chickens, growing various fruits, especially strawberries before moving to Libertyville in 1960. She was a member of the United Methodist Church in Libertyville and a former employee at International Harvester, Hollister and Abbott Laboratories.

Marguerite was also a Red Cross Aid during WWII, a USO Hostess, Libertyville Senior of the Year and enjoyed reading, baking, playing cards and volunteering at the Blue Smock and The Winchester House. She also enjoyed working at the church rummage sale for over 50 years.

Traveling was Marguerite's passion, visiting Europe several times and cruising the Greek Isles. She also visited all but 7 states in the United States. Mall walking was a religion for her. When she would walk, she walked all over downtown Libertyville, to the bank for her morning coffee and glimpse of the newspaper, to the library for her books, and to her favorite restaurant, The Picnic Basket.

Surviving are her daughters, Diane Turner and Marlene Krein (Colin Brummet); Granddaughter, Lauren (James) Rush and 3 Great Grandchildren, Gabriel, Sage and Rahlee.

She was preceded in death by her husband Armin Massin in 2003 and by her son David Stecki in 2009.
