



Rev. Nelson J. Irving

Rev. Nelson James Irving, 81, passed away on Thursday, June 28, 2018 at Northwestern Memorial Hospital in Chicago. He was born in Tulsa, OK in 1936 and received his BA from Tulsa University, followed by his Masters of Divinity from the Phillips Theological Seminary in Enid, OK. Pastor Irving served churches in Missouri, Nebraska, Tennessee and Illinois. He served Community Christian Church in Lincolnshire, IL from 1972-1984 and again from 1997 until his retirement in 2004, after which he served as Minister Emeritus until his death.

Surviving are his wife Ann; 2 daughters, Joy Irving Snyder of Kansas City, MO and Rebecca Irving of St. Petersburg, FL; 3 grandchildren, Travis and Marisa Snyder and Sara Casagrande; 2 Step Children, Jane (Brian) Eaton and Frank (Mary) Myers; 3 Step Grandchildren, Christopher Eaton, Samantha and Morgan Myers.

He was preceded in death by his parents, James and Nina Irving and by his brother Don.

A memorial service will be held at 2 PM, Sunday, July 15, 2018 at the Community Christian Church, 1970 Riverwoods Road, Lincolnshire, IL 60069 with a reception to follow.
