There is a large City in Bavaria by the name of LANDSHUT. Probably his family incl. his mother must have some stories to tell. One, a baby boy born just during the liberation time on the end of the war. Also the names tell me there must be a Yugoslavia background where many nationalities lived together but too often under much stress, exploding too often, like bringing on WWI, then Hitler used it and much more exploded again in the 90's when Yugoslavia split up and more wars in-between all the Nationalities. The immigration by ship and finally have gotten the necessary papers to come to the U.S.A. must have been a real welcome, happiness for all to come the New World, the U.S.A. I came here myself on the end of 1963 seeking more Freedom, Opportunities etc. but by my own choice being a few years older than Reinhardt. God bless him and we pray to take him home to the final place of rest, peace for all.
