Sally had a beautiful life full of love and family and friends. Her story began in Chicago, born on August 22, 1932, to Howard and Margaret Dyslin. Sally passed away peacefully surrounded by family Monday, May 28, 2018. In her younger years growing up in Beverly she pursued her love of dance, taking ballet and tap lessons. In the late 1940's and early 1950's, Sally earned a position with the Dorothy Hild Dance Troupe, and danced professionally, performing in shows at the Edgewater Beach Hotel, the Palmer House, and the Oriental Theatre. She had always dreamed of being a dancer and traveling the world. That all changed when she met Dick Goodman, and after a whirlwind 3-month romance, they married in September 1951. By December of 1952 they had their first child, and then 3 more in quick succession. They were young and in love, and Dick would say, "there's always room for one more."
