“ Sherri was a very sweet soul with a gentle demeanor. We had many good conversations over the years, and had some good arguments, and I visited from Chicago when I could. She had an intense curiosity about city life in Chicago. At one point she ventured out to meet me to see Red Moon Theatre doing a large scale puppet production in an industrial neighborhood on the near west side. As was her style, she was very nicely dressed, wearing high heels, as we trudged through a very desolate urban part of town. She showed a lot of resilience as we stumbled across old and broken cobblestone pavement on the way to the show. We sometimes met for dinner out in suburban neighborhoods that were closer to her home. One of my favorite visits with her was when she came to Chicago to hear the monks singing at one of the only Churches that still has a Latin mass. I got there early and didn't see her in the Church so I mistakenly sat in a row where the monks were to sit. Next thing I knew I was given some music to sing as the monks filed into my pew. We both had a good laugh about that later. After the concert we spent some time looking at the many relics that were housed in the Church. We shared an interest in the ancient traditions of the Church and often had long phone conversations about this. I had stayed in touch with her since the news that she was struggling with her health and we talked briefly when she had enough strength, other times we texted each other. I had hoped to see her while she was still here, but the word came suddenly that she had passed yesterday. I'll miss her very much. I wish all family and friends comfort and healing during this difficult time.
