William A. Madole, 86, passed away Monday, Jan. 7, 2013, at the Wealshire in Lincolnshire. He was born June 8, 1926, in Libertyville, where he remained a resident all his life. He was a 1944 graduate of LHS, attended Kendall College in Evanston and was a graduate of Carthage College in Kenosha. Bill was a superintendent for Pickus Construction in Waukegan, retiring in 1991 and was a member of the Bricklayers Local #20. He was a past Noble Grand of the Libertyville Lodge, Independent Order of Odd Fellows and Past District Deputy Grand Master of the I.O.O.F. He was a US Army Air Corps veteran and an active member and Past Commander of the Libertyville American Legion Post #329. He was a former assistant chief for the Libertyville Fire Department and past president of the Lake County Fireman's Association. Bill was an active member of the United Methodist Church in Libertyville, was a Republican Precinct Committeeman and trustee for the Village of Libertyville for 15 years. He was also a past president of the Lakeside Cemetery Association. Bill was very proud to be a part of the Honor Flight to Washington, DC. on Aug. 4, 2010. He is survived by his wife of 67 years, Myrle Madole; four children, Linda (Roger) Busch and Penny (Al) Arana, both of Round Lake, and George (Martha) Madole and Richard Madole, both of Libertyville; six grandchildren, Michael and Jeffrey Busch, Brenda Harper, Maggie and Bill Madole and Sabrina Ortiz; six great-grandchildren; brother, James (Blanche) Madole of Toluca, IL; and sister, Cleo Melendy of Libertyville. He was preceded in death by his son, Terry Madole in 1963; and brothers,
