



William "Bob" Warnock

December 31, 1923 - May 10, 2020

William R. "Bob" Warnock, 96, passed away on Sunday, May 10, 2020 in Libertyville, IL. He was born December 31, 1923 in Burlington, Iowa, and served in the US Army, 84th Infantry Division (Railsplitters), 334th Medical Detachment during WWII, where he was wounded while performing his duties as a field medic. After the war, he received numerous medals, including the Purple Heart and Bronze Star Medal. Bob received his bachelor's degree in Chemistry from the University of Chicago, was formerly employed by the ANSUL Corp. of Marinette, WI, now a division of Tyco Industries and later for the General Fire Extinguisher Co. of Northbrook, IL for over 30 years. He was a devoted member of St. Joseph Church in Libertyville, serving on various committees and as a long-time usher. Bob was also active in the Knights of Columbus for over 60 years, having served as Grand Knight and Financial Secretary, and was a member of the K of C, Cardinal Stritch Council of Libertyville and Fourth Degree Bishop Quarter Assembly at the time of his death. He and his family also volunteered for Libertyville Days for many years. Surviving are his 3 children, Robert Warnock, Patricia (Gary) Winsor and Kathleen (Paul Harrington) Warnock; 3 grandchildren, Alexander, Siobhan and Kimberly, son-in-law, Kevin Kueny, sisters-in-law, Mary (John) Warnock and Jean (Richard) Warnock, cherished step-grandchildren, nieces, nephews and cousins, and close friend, Don Kueny.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Christine Warnock on February 1, 1997 and his daughter, Susan Kueny on August 21, 2013. He was also preceded in

death by his parents and brothers, Steven, Thomas and John Warnock. His surviving brother, Richard passed away on December 4, 2021.

A visitation will begin at 9:30 a.m. followed by a memorial mass at 10:30 a.m.
